### **More on Deputy Administrator Nadeau**

Mr. Nadeau is the Deputy Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration for the DOT and oversees day-to-day operation of the FHWA under Administrator Mendez. He has focused significant attention on spearheading the development and administration of Every Day Counts (EDC) on behalf of Administrator Mendez since the Administrator launched his initiative in 2010. Since 2003, Deputy Administrator Nadeau served as the Maine Department of Transportation's (MaineDOT) Deputy Commissioner for Policy, Planning and Communications. In this role, he was responsible for state and federal policy, statewide transportation system planning, communications, freight and business services, and passenger transportation. Among MaineDOT's accomplishments during his tenure, were the development of an integrated approach to transportation system planning and the publication of "Connecting Maine", the department's statewide multi-modal long-range transportation plan.
